Dismount bicycles upon entering event. Bikes are not permitted on sidewalks or in congested pedestrian areas. Complimentary bike parking is available at the west entrance of the event grounds.

COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABILITY

St. Louis Earth Day is committed to utilizing the best options for ensuring a memorable event with as little environmental impact as possible. Here are just a few ways that we honor our commitment to environmental stewardship.

WASTE

By implementing our event-greening Recycling On the Go program, 91% of the waste produced at the 2014 Festival was diverted from the landfill (4.111 lbs.).

To reduce waste, we ask vendors to limit handouts. DO YOUR PART by returning your program for reuse or recycling before you leave (or recycle when you get home).

Styrofoam is so last century – that's why we've banned polystyrene/#6 plastic from the Festival for the past eight years and have never looked back. This material is rarely recycled and never breaks down in a landfill.

We've also banned bottled water because of its environment impact. Fill up at one of the water stations indicated on the map and check out the water trailer, provided by the City of St. Louis.

Take your waste to one of the seven Recycling Stations where volunteers will help you figure out what is recyclable, compostable or headed for the landfill.





ENERGY

Generators donated by **Energy Tree**, are propane-fueled prototypes for a new approach to electrifying events. These generators release about half of the emissions as standard diesel generators. Propane is donated by the Missouri Propane Gas Association. A Solar Shed installed by **EFS Energy** will power select sponsor booths.

The energy used to power the Festival has been offset 100% with emission-free Missouri Wind

with Renewable Energy Certificates courtesy of Ameren Missouri's Pure Power program. This offset means that St. Louis Earth Day has reduced its carbon footprint from electricity use by 3,167 tons of carbon dioxide; the same environmental benefit as not driving a car for 3 months.

PURCHASING

Event t-shirts and hats are either 100% organic cotton or an organic cotton/post-consumer P.E.T. recycled polyester blend, designed and printed locally (\$15).

Portable toilets from Johnny On the Spot use eco-friendly chemicals and recycled-content paper products.

Earth Day Challenge awards eco-friendly gifts like LED lightbulbs from Challenge sponsor Metro Lighting, Better Life cleaning products and Metro Transit day-passes, to encourage attendees to make positive environmental behavior choices.

Our promotional materials are printed on American-made, Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified, 100% post-consumer recycled paper. Our local printer, The Advertisers **Printing Company**, uses soy and solvent-free inks and emission-free coatings. They hold Rainforest Alliance and Sustainable Green Printing Partnership (SGP) certifications and offset 100% of their energy use through Ameren Missouri's Pure Power program.




